Winter and colder days are here! This is your friendly reminder to check that you have cold weather uniforms (pants, trackies, jumpers) ready for those chilly days and they are labelled.

#### **COLD** and **FLU**

With the arrival of colder weather, cases of influenza (the flu) and COVID are Increasing throughout Victoria. Our community is at risk of higher rates of students and staff affected by the flu, COVID and other illnesses over the winter season. To help keep your child and our school community safe, please take the following steps if your child has any cold or flu-like symptoms:

- keep your child at home until their symptoms pass
- common flu-like symptoms include a high fever, cough, runny nose, loss of appetite, body aches and feeling extremely weak and tired
- diagnosis of the flu can only be confirmed by a doctor after a nose or throat swab
- encourage your child to wash their hands regularly and ask them to cover their nose and mouth when sneezing and coughing.

Green pod are using Boomwhackers this term to play well known radio songs, purple pod are writing some new songs, and orange pod are rocking their class bands.







Students in Room 18 have been very productive so far this term.

In Literacy we have been learning about Procedural texts, including looking at the structure and practising how to write a procedure. Students have enjoyed sequencing pictures in order and writing and following steps for a range of procedures.

In Maths, we have been looking at Pattern and Measurement. Students enjoyed continuing and creating various shape, colour and mixed patterns, as well as practising skip counting patterns. Our more recent topic in Maths has seen students measuring the length and height of items around the classroom and Pod using informal and formal units of measurement and then comparing the size of a range of items.

Students have shown great interest in our Science term topic 'All mixed up', as it has allowed exploration and experimentation of mixing different liquids and ingredients together. Students have enjoyed predicting what might happen and then recording or drawing the results of what actually happened.

It was lovely to go on an outing to Noreuil Park earlier this week, where students were able to use a range of exercise equipment and have some fun at the playground. We are now looking forward to watching the 'Freaky Friday' performance at the Scots School next week.

The Department of Transport & Planning <u>Travel Pass program</u> provides free 30-day Travel Passes to Victorian students who are experiencing crisis to ensure they can continue to attend school by using public transport.

The program was recently expanded to include caregivers of eligible students, ensuring that they can accompany a student on their journey.

Students' eligibility is determined on a case-by-case basis by the school and the passes can be used across Victoria's public transport network.

#### Travel Passes

Primary, secondary and specialist schools can receive 30-day Travel Passes free of charge to give to students in crisis.

Travel Passes can be used on:

bus, train and tram trips in metropolitan Melbourne (Zone 1 and 2)

all regional town buses

PTV inter-town buses

V/Line coaches

V/Line trains.

Students can apply directly to their school.

Government schools can apply on behalf of students via their State Schools' Relief online portal.

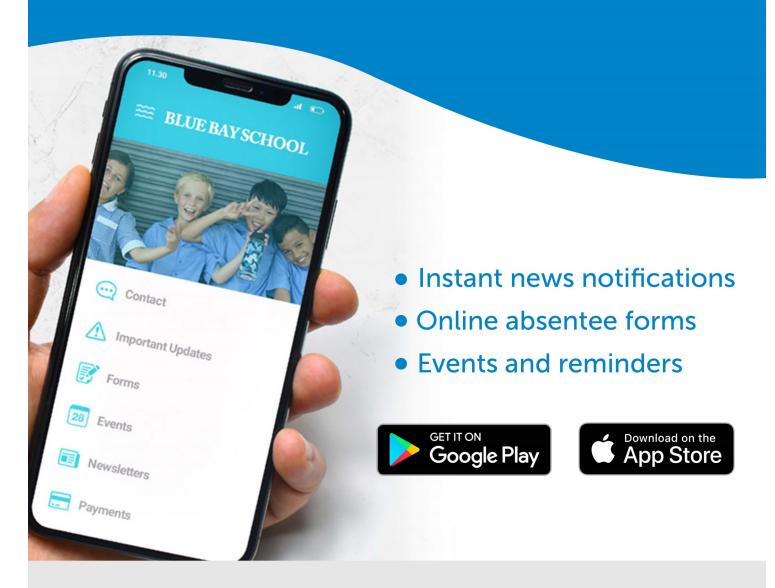
