- Speak with your child's classroom teacher to ensure your child is not missing out on educational opportunities.


Remember, every day counts.



In Literacy, we have continued to learn about procedural texts. Our focus has been on mastering the art of sequencing and following procedures, with a highlight being our hands-on experience in learning how to make recipes. Last week we learnt to make pizza and this week it was Scones. Students have enthusiastically accepted the challenge of not only understanding the structure of procedural texts but also working on their own procedural writing skills.

Over in Maths, we learned about measurement in the first few weeks. From measuring our heights in centimetres to engaging in the competition of creating the heaviest trays using blocks, our students have been fully engaged in exploring various units of measurement. This week, our focus is on subitising. Through engaging board games involving dice, students have been sharpening their practical counting abilities while having a lot of fun.

In respectful relationships, students are learning about the concept of personal strengths and discovering how to cultivate them through cooperative games. For our term topic 'Chemical Science' we are conducting fascinating experiments to observe reactions firsthand, students have been actively involved in predicting outcomes and documenting results with enthusiasm. As we look ahead to the remainder of the term, the Room 12 staff is looking forward to a fun term of learning and continuing to build our relationships and routines.

The Department of Transport & Planning <u>Travel Pass program</u> provides free 30-day Travel Passes to Victorian students who are experiencing crisis to ensure they can continue to attend school by using public transport.

The program was recently expanded to include caregivers of eligible students, ensuring that they can accompany a student on their journey.

Students' eligibility is determined on a case-by-case basis by the school and the passes can be used across Victoria's public transport network.

Travel Passes

Primary, secondary and specialist schools can receive 30-day Travel Passes free of charge to give to students in crisis.

Travel Passes can be used on:

bus, train and tram trips in metropolitan Melbourne (Zone 1 and 2)

all regional town buses

PTV inter-town buses

V/Line coaches

V/Line trains.

How to apply

Students can apply directly to their school.

Government schools can apply on behalf of students via their State Schools' Relief online portal.

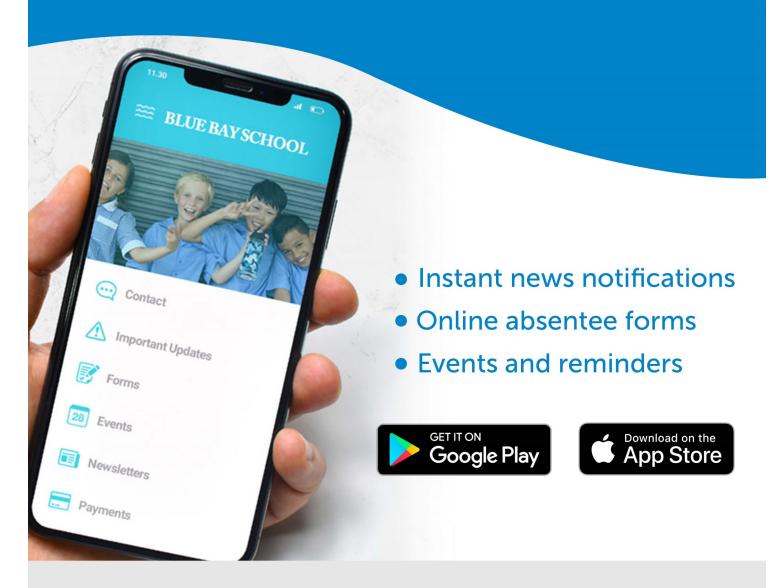
