

FIC (known as R3) News

Term 2 this year has been very busy at FIC. We started a new Humanities Term Topic called All Mixed Up. Through the unit we are learning about mixtures, how to make and separate them and what their purposes are. This is a very hands on unit that has been lots of fun to be a part of. So far, we have made playdough, Ooobleck, created rust, learned about chromatography and made marble paper with common vegetable oil! You can see the amazing pictures below.







We have also been exploring the Term Topic in the Science Lab, where we have explored what happens if we heat metals (they expand and then when it cools, they shrink back to normal). Also, we explored when we burn steel wool, the steel wool weighs more than it did before we burnt it – because it is now mixed with oxygen which then turns into iron oxide (rust). This was fascinating to watch.







Another very cool thing we got to investigate was a kidney. We learned all about how the kidney functions and what it's main purpose is – then we got to cut it up and locate all it's internal components. We all were very intrigued as to what each section does and we even got to use a microscope to see it in great detail.

Food Tech and Life Skills has continued to be filled with lots of learning this term.

In Food Tech students have continued to make a new recipe each week with Apple Crumble featured here from our Yellow Pod students and Vegetable Fritters and Gulab Jamun (Indian Doughnuts) from our Purple Pod students. We have been continuing to work on following each step in a recipe, and using our equipment safely, especially sharp knives and hot objects.

In Life Skills we have continued to learn housekeeping skills. We have practised the art of folding sheets, changing doona covers and working out how to undo and redo buttons on the doona covers. Cleaning the bathroom (and even the toilet) has been a surprising highlight for many students as has using the vacuum cleaner safely and appropriately.

Next semester students will swap their lessons so complete the other subject so please keep a lookout for the relevant note to check for allergies and reactions to different food items and cleaning products and return to school.

The Department of Transport & Planning <u>Travel Pass program</u> provides free 30-day Travel Passes to Victorian students who are experiencing crisis to ensure they can continue to attend school by using public transport.

The program was recently expanded to include caregivers of eligible students, ensuring that they can accompany a student on their journey.

Students' eligibility is determined on a case-by-case basis by the school and the passes can be used across Victoria's public transport network.

Travel Passes

Primary, secondary and specialist schools can receive 30-day Travel Passes free of charge to give to students in crisis.

Travel Passes can be used on:

bus, train and tram trips in metropolitan Melbourne (Zone 1 and 2)

all regional town buses

PTV inter-town buses

V/Line coaches

V/Line trains.

How to apply

Students can apply directly to their school.

Government schools can apply on behalf of students via their State Schools' Relief online portal.
