
In Literacy we have continued to look at different procedural texts and what is involved in writing steps for various procedures, as well as focusing on editing our writing, using basic checklists to help us.

The Department of Transport & Planning <u>Travel Pass program</u> provides free 30-day Travel Passes to Victorian students who are experiencing crisis to ensure they can continue to attend school by using public transport.

The program was recently expanded to include caregivers of eligible students, ensuring that they can accompany a student on their journey.

Students' eligibility is determined on a case-by-case basis by the school and the passes can be used across Victoria's public transport network.

Travel Passes

Primary, secondary and specialist schools can receive 30-day Travel Passes free of charge to give to students in crisis.

Travel Passes can be used on:

bus, train and tram trips in metropolitan Melbourne (Zone 1 and 2) all regional town buses PTV inter-town buses

V/Line coaches

V/Line trains.
